CORE REQUIREMENTS:

- Eligibility to work in the UK
- Minimum C grade in GCSE English and maths (or equivalent)
- Minimum A-level/equivalent qualification at grade B or above in subject relevant to the subject you choose to tutor (English or maths)
- Minimum 2.1 degree or above (2.2 degrees will be considered if you have a strong academic record in A-level English or maths)

FURTHER REQUIREMENTS:

- Available for two days of tutor training in January 2020
- A minimum of 2 hours commitment a week
- Commitment to working a minimum of 12 weeks between January 2020 to May 2020
- Ability to travel to your placement college
- If successful, you'll need an up-to-date DBS Check
